A TRANSFER AGREEMENT
BETWEEN
HERKIMER COUNTY COMMUNITY COLLEGE
AND
CAZENOVIA COLLEGE
APRIL 2014**

This agreement establishes a pathway between Herkimer Community College and Cazenovia College. Herkimer County Community College students, upon completion of a directed sequence of coursework leading to an associate degree from Herkimer County Community College, are guaranteed admission to Cazenovia College at junior status.

Full-Time Study

Students studying on a full-time basis can complete the Cazenovia College Inclusive Early Childhood Education (B.S.) degree in two years, as long as the required course work is followed with the minimum passing grades. The curriculum warrants one summer session prior to the student's senior year.

Part-Time Study

Students studying on a part-time basis will complete the Cazenovia College Inclusive Early Childhood Education (B.S.) degree at Herkimer County Community College's campus. Students can complete the degree requirements in three years, as long as the required coursework is followed with the minimum passing grades.

STUDENT SELECTION

The ideal candidate will have successfully completed high school with demonstrated proficiency in all core areas. The student must be a full or part-time matriculated student in Herkimer County Community College's Early Childhood Education (A.A.S.) program.

STUDENT ACADEMIC ADVISEMENT

Herkimer County Community College staff and faculty in cooperation with Cazenovia College assume responsibility for advising students who enter into the agreement. Academic curriculum advising guides will be used to communicate degree requirements to students, including recommendations for elective selection. While advising guides will be reviewed once per year for necessary revisions, any changes to coursework or academic curriculum will warrant an immediate revision.

TRANSFER ADMISSION

Students are required to submit an application, essay, final high school transcript, official transcript from Herkimer County Community College and any other college previously attended. An official final Herkimer County Community College transcript, including documentation of an associate degree, will be required once the student completes the final semester.

Recommended Application Deadlines:

While Cazenovia College practices rolling admission, the following recommended deadlines should be considered when applying for admission through this agreement.

Fall Admission –March 15th

Spring Admission–October 15th

GPA Requirements:

Students must have a minimum of a 2.5 cumulative grade point average for acceptance to Cazenovia College.

Transferring on Credits:

Coursework with a grade of "C" or higher will transfer to the appropriate Cazenovia College course. Please refer to the course requirement section of the agreement.
