## Study Abroad/Washington D.C. Internship

Students choose between semester-long study abroad programs at Canterbury Christ Church University in Kent, United Kingdom or Nagoya Gakuin University in Nagoya, Japan. Both of these locations involve internationally-themed coursework at a foreign university while participating in sponsored study trips. Students pay the same tuition and room and board that they would studying at home, including any financial aid. Students earn 15 credits that apply to their Cazenovia College degree.

Washington, D.C. Internship – Cazenovia College partners with the Washington Internship Institute to broaden students' internship opportunities by spending a semester (or a summer) in the nation's capital. With hundreds of D.C. area internship sites to choose from, the Washington Internship Institute represents a tremendous asset for International Studies students to gain valuable pre-career experience and network with professionals working in the field. Students who participate in the semester-long program earn six internship credits and take six credits of coursework while in D.C.
